

Visiting Innovation Faculty Role

Founded at the Abramson Cancer Center at the University of Pennsylvania, PC3I's mission is to make cancer care better for patients, clinicians, and communities. We actively build and foster a multidisciplinary community of change agents dedicated to creating, testing, and scaling solutions to the most intractable problems in cancer care today.

Visiting Innovation Faculty serve for the duration of 1 academic year (July through June). To qualify for consideration, individuals must be appointed faculty at an academic medical center at the Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor level and conduct research or practice-facing initiatives focused on clinical transformation, payment models and affordability, health equity, augmented and artificial intelligence, and incentives to change behavior in cancer care.

PC3I Visiting Faculty have two essential commitments:

1. Contribute to a vibrant intellectual environment through virtual attendance at work-in-progress meetings, speaker series, PC3I Innovation retreats, and Innovation Faculty meetings (a maximum time commitment of about 1.5 hours per month).
2. Facilitate one prepared talk on a subject area aligned with the Visiting Faculty's areas of research, to be presented in person in Philadelphia as part of a two-day engagement event with fellow PC3I Faculty, with travel and lodging expenses covered by PC3I.

The benefits of serving as a PC3I Visiting Faculty are:

1. Access to a multidisciplinary and collaborative intellectual environment;
2. Elevation of one's work and accomplishments via PC3I's multi-platform and robust communications efforts.
